

SCHOOR DEPALMA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION CHANGES ITS NAME TO CMX COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

**New Officer and Trustee Appointments Also Announced;
More than 2,000 children receiving back-to-school supplies**

MANALAPAN, NJ - September 28, 2007 – Schoor DePalma Community Foundation, dedicated to servicing communities where Schoor DePalma employees live, travel, play, and work, has announced that it has changed its name to CMX Community Foundation. The Foundation also donated over 4,000 plastic bags which will be used to transport food to the Food Bank of Monmouth & Ocean Counties located in Neptune, NJ.
